

Creative Technologies Faculty Information

An exciting opportunity has arisen for an ambitious, motivated and committed individual to join the college's expanding Creative Technologies faculty. Teaching art and technology at Shuttleworth will mean you become a valued and integral member of a supportive team with a range of teaching experiences.

At Shuttleworth College our students are at the heart of everything we do. Our driving purpose is to make sure that they enjoy their time at school and achieve their very best, whatever their next steps. We view confidence, independence and creativity as essential to this aim and wish to appoint a qualified teacher who will inspire, motivate and engage our young people.

The Creative Technologies faculty encompasses Art and Design and Design and Technology at Key Stage 3. From September 2021, these pupils will engage in a 1.5 hour lesson in each subject per week.

Within Art and Design pupils study a wide range of contexts; developing theoretical and contextual knowledge and practical skills across a variety of media including drawing, painting, printmaking, sculpture and ceramics. The Design and Technology curriculum includes food and nutrition, polymers, timbers, paper and boards, textiles, electronics and CAD/CAM.

At Key Stage 4 we currently offer GCSE Art, Craft and Design, GCSE Three-Dimensional Design, GCSE Design and Technology and WJEC Hospitality and Catering. From September 2021 Year 10 pupils will engage in five hours of lessons per subject per fortnight and Year 11, six hours per fortnight.

Much work has been done by staff in recent years to develop the curriculum and teaching and learning strategies within the faculty. We hugely value the contributions of teachers of all levels of experience and thrive on shared good practice.

The faculty is well resourced, with access to computers and laptops, laser cutter, 3D printers, ceramic kiln and sublimation printer amongst other equipment. We also benefit from the experience and contributions of two faculty technicians.

The successful candidate will be a specialist with passion for our subjects and an eagerness to inspire our students to reach their full potential. You will have the ability to consistently deliver captivating and inspiring lessons; engaging students through an outstanding, rewarding learning experience.
