School Context

Longridge High School is situated on the outskirts of Longridge, a small manufacturing and market town between Preston and the Ribble Valley. We have 50+ teaching staff and approximately 800 pupils. The school serves the local community and has a large catchment area encompassing neighbouring villages, a large rural district and urban areas of Preston. The school was originally built in 1959, with additional accommodation added in subsequent years. School facilities have been continuously updated and refurbished.

As a school we are ambitious for all our young people in all areas of school life. We are passionate about and committed to the belief that every young person deserves an excellent education. As such, we aim to provide excellent all round learning experiences, both in the classroom and beyond, for every pupil, allowing them to thrive and develop in a supportive, secure and challenging environment where they can enjoy, aspire and achieve. We prepare every young person for life through a consistent approach to excellent behaviour, good manners and hard work, embodied in our school's core values 'Respect, Learn, Grow, Together'. The Department

Resources and Facilities

The Department has one large and well-resourced teaching room, with a large television displaying the teacher PC. There are 15 PCs all with MIDI controller keyboards, equipped with Cubase 11 Pro and Muscore 3. There is also a pair of practice rooms that double as a recording studio (also running Cubase 11 Pro), an instrument store and two large store cupboards. The school has recently purchased a full class set of brass instruments for whole class instrumental teaching.

Staffing

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One subject specialist in school teaches music.

There is a team of peripatetic teachers who teach individual pupils across a range of instruments during the school day.

Curriculum

All pupils study Music at KS3. Pupils receive 1 hour per week in Years 7 and 8. Year 9 pupils are on a carousel with Art to deliver 1 hour per fortnight.

KS4 Option Groups

We have one option group for Music in Year 10 (9 pupils) and one in Year 11 (11 pupils).

Extra-Curricular Programme

The school currently runs a number of extra-curricular groups:

- Beginners Training Band (Brass and Woodwind)
- School Band (Brass, Woodwind and Percussion)
- School Choir
- A Capella Group (this is by invite only)
- Rock School (guitar, bass, drums and vocals)
- The peri team deliver individual 20 minute lessons to pupils on drums, guitar, singing, piano, brass and woodwind instruments.

There is also a school musical/drama production every other year as well as performing art shows and house competitions throughout the year.
