The successful candidate will be an outstanding teacher with the energy and vision to inspire a love of learning in our SEND pupils and the motivation and commitment to ensure that they achieve positive outcomes. He/she will have the strategic overview of the academic and pastoral outcomes of pupils with SEND and in partnership with the Senior Leadership Team will have a responsibility for ensuring that they have access to a broad and balanced curriculum which is inclusive of their needs.

The successful candidate will take responsibility for the day-to-day implementation and operation of the SEND policy across the school and will work closely with staff, parents & carers and other agencies. He/she will provide professional guidance to staff in order to help best meet the needs of pupils with SEND, including offering relevant CPD and making the effective use of resources so that pupils with SEND reach their potential.

The successful candidate will also be one of the school's DSLs and the designated teacher for looked after children.

The successful candidate will hold National Award for Special Educational needs Co-ordination (NASENCO), or be willing to undertake and obtain the NPQ for SENCOs
