Job Description - CLASS TEACHER

MAIN PURPOSE:

- To carry out responsibilities to promote and safeguard the welfare of all children according to the school's policy and procedures.
- To work towards the School Aims and agreed policies, including the latest issue of 'Keeping children safe in education'.
- To show loyalty towards developing and maintaining the ethos of the school and work as a member of a team.
- To carry out the professional duties of a school teacher as described in the appropriate sections of the School Teachers` Pay and Conditions Document and have due regard to Teaching Standards (2012)
- Be responsible for the learning and achievement of all children in the class ensuring equality of opportunity for all.
- Be responsible and accountable for achieving the highest possible standards in work and behaviour.
- Treat all children with dianity, building relationships rooted in mutual respect.
- Work proactively and effectively in collaboration and partnership with learners, parents/carers, governors, other staff and external agencies in the best interests of children.

Main duties and activities

- Understand and implement the requirements of the National Curriculum 2014 / EYFS Framework.
- To provide an interesting and effective learning environment for the children.
- To attend appropriate and relevant courses, including staff training, and disseminate knowledge to other staff.
- To involve parents in their children's learning.
- To fulfil a role as subject leader.
- To help foster a joy in learning and life.

General duties and activities

- To be responsible for the teaching of any mixed ability class of children within the primary school age range.
- To teach all areas of the curriculum using a child centred approach.
- Produce effective long, medium and short term curriculum plans to carry out classroom teaching.
- To exercise a variety of teaching and classroom management strategies appropriate to different teaching contexts and the changing needs of the children.
- To ensure the effective deployment of Teaching Assistant support in the classroom.
- To encourage a high and consistent standard of children's work.
- Set appropriate and demanding expectations for pupils` learning, motivation and presentation of work making effective provision for all groups of children.
- To undertake continuous assessment and keep full up to date records of children's progress in line with school policy, informing teaching and learning.
- Prepare and deliver Parent Evenings as well as detailed written reports for every pupil.

- To take an active part in the development and implementation of the School Improvement Plan.
- To work as a member of a team, attend and participate in staff meetings.
- To take assemblies in rotation with other teachers.
- To share in all necessary duties.
- To take an active part in school life beyond the classroom.
- To create opportunities to contribute to pupils' personal, spiritual, moral and cultural development.
- To take a full and active part in the school's Performance Management procedures.
- To give children regular feedback in accordance with the school's marking policy.
- To set homework and plan other out of class activities to consolidate and extend the children's knowledge and understanding.

REVIEW:

- To foster good relationships with all members of the school and local community including parents.
- To promote the school and all it stands for on all occasions, in particular, work with stakeholders.
- To celebrate the successes of the school at every opportunity.
- To act as a model of professional conduct and presentation, demonstrating high personal standards of expertise and commitment.
- To carry out instructions in accordance with any directions which may reasonably be given by the Headteacher.
