Accommodation

Science is taught in seven state of the art specialist laboratories and a classroom. A large prep room services the Curriculum Area and there is also a staff workroom, which is used for planning and meetings. It should also be noted that the Science laboratories and classrooms enjoy the best views in the College with panoramic views of Pendle Hill!

The Curriculum Area is well resourced, with a range of textbooks across both Key Stages, as well as a set of mobile wireless laptops, iPads and associated software. Recent investment has been made in new laboratory apparatus and each lab has a good stock of basic equipment. Investment is being made in more specialist equipment, including new technology, and this is planned to continue over the next few academic years.

All students at Pendle Vale College study a balanced course in Science at both Key Stages 3 and 4. At Key Stage 3, all pupils take 3 hours of science per week. Our new schemes of learning allow us to spend more time investigating why science is relevant and important to our everyday lives and the feedback from pupils tells us that they really enjoy studying Science at Pendle Vale College.

At Key Stage 4, pupils follow the new AQA science: Trilogy or separate science specification. Our curriculum structure at KS4 means that pupils can follow a pathway that is suitable for them. All pupils follow a minimum of 2 GCSEs or equivalent.

The Curriculum Area has been at the forefront of the introduction of STEM and related activities within Pendle Vale College. In partnership with other key players in Mathematics and Design Technology many exciting activities have been organised both in college and for students from local Primaries.

At Pendle Vale the Science teachers and technician work hard to provide specialist, well-resourced facilities that are both safe and stimulating for the pupils to develop their scientific knowledge and understanding and to maintain their level of enthusiasm.
