[E] Application Letter

The letter should be clear, concise and related to the specific post

The letter must make reference to the ways in which applicants can support the Christian ethos and mission of the school.

The letter should make clear the candidate's experience and ability to lead national curriculum subjects (particularly interested in science, PE and maths).

The letter must demonstrate the candidates experience and skills in teaching within KS1 and KS2

The letter must demonstrate experience of teaching in mixed-aged and if possible, cross key stage classes.

[F] Application Form

The Blackburn Diocesan Application Form should be used. You need to provide a faith reference. This should be someone who can support your assertion that you can actively promote our Christian vision but does not *have* to be an ordained cleric, for example this could be a current line manager in a Church School.
